TJC SCHOOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

School Hours

Age 3 & 4	8:30am - 12:00pm
Age 5 & 6	8:00am - 12:00pm
Enrichment programme:	12:30pm - 5:00pm

Punctuality

Morning Session

Children of Age 5 and 6 must be in the school by 8:00am. Children of Age 3 and 4 must be in the school by 8:30am.

*Teachers and staff start the day with devotion and prayer daily. we will attend to your child at 7:45am.

*For children who reach school before 7:45am, we seek parents' cooperation to ensure safety of the children within the school compound.

At Tadika Juara Cerdik (TJC) we believe that children can only learn effectively if they attend school regularly. It is important that children arrive and leave school on time. Children who arrive late are greatly disadvantaged because they miss starting the day with their friends and the beginning of lessons.

It is also important that children establish good routines and habits in preparation for the rest of their lives. Punctuality is a life skill that they need to develop whilst they are young. We understand that there may be rare occasions when you are unavoidably late due to unforeseen circumstances. On these occasions, please ensure the school is informed.

Dismissal

Children are to be picked up no later **than ½ an hour after school dismissal**. All late pick-ups will be imposed a late fee of RM10 each time thereafter.

When you're late, kindly park your car at a parking lot and proceed to Block C to pick up your child.

Early Collection of Children

Parents who wish to collect your child before dismissal, must inform the school office beforehand. Parents are required to fill in the record book provided, upon collection. Early collection is 11:30am.

Security Card

Children will only be released to parents/guardians and to authorised person(s) with a security card. Collection without a security card, will only be permitted after verification with the parent/guardian.

*On days, if the regular person is not able to pick your child up, please call the school to provide info of the alternative arrangement.

Placement of the Security-card

Please place the security card on your car's dashboard (tilted up), to enable teachers on duty at different stations to call out your child's name.

The security is to be displayed in the morning upon entering Dream Centre. Also to be displayed when you pick your child up in the afternoon.

Absences

The Department of Education requires a letter for all absenteeism to be kept in the school records. The Principal and class teacher must be notified beforehand if your child will be away for more than a week.

Consultation with Teachers

Parents are welcome to discuss any concerns with teachers in school. However, to avoid undue interruptions to the school, appointments must be made with the respective teacher for a mutually acceptable time.

Birthday Celebration

Parents who wish to celebrate their child's birthday in school will need to fill in a birthday party request form. Forms must be completed and handed in to the class teacher with at least 7 days notice. Requests must be approved by the school office. Parents are required to provide serviettes, paper plates, plastic cutlery, matches/lighter and birthday candles.

Parties are permitted only from Monday to Thursday.

Belongings

Parents are to ensure that belongings are labeled with your child's name.

We do not encourage children to bring any valuables to school.

Jewelry of any sort (including toy) are not permitted.

The school reserves the right to remove any article worn by any child which may pose harm to the child or to others.

Things to Bring

The following are to be brought to school daily:

- 1. School bag
- 2. Water tumbler & lunchbox/snackbox
- 3. Extra clothing
- 4. Handkerchief
- 5. Hand Sanitizer (Teacher will keep in the school for the younger children).
- 6. Stationeries (Pencil box, pencil, colour pencil, scissors, glue)

Homework Pouch

Homework or messages from school will be kept in the homework pouch. Please ensure that the completed homework or signed messages are returned with the homework pouch.

Book Replacement

Responsibility is one of the character traits that we want to instill in our children. Therefore, children are encouraged to take good care of their school books. If lost or misplaced the book must be repurchased/replaced.

Snack

Biscuits will be given to your child daily for snack. Please ensure that your child brings a water tumbler to school everyday.

Water tumblers must be unbreakable. Cans and glass bottles are not permitted. Milk bottles are not permitted in school.

Liability

While reasonable care will be taken, the school, staff and teachers, will not be held responsible for any loss of valuables, accident, injury or mishap that happens to the child while in school.

SCHOOL FEES

Terms & Conditions

- 1. School term will be stipulated by the Ministry of Educstin from **Febuary 2025 to December 2025** (11 months).
- 2. An initial payment of **RM1,000.00 (Non-Refundable)** is payable upon confirmation of registration/enrolment. This initial payment will be credited toward the Term 3 fee.
- 3. There are **3 payment terms** as follows; subjected to Ministry of Education's (MOE) calendar:

The academic year fee is structured and thoughtfully calculated, taking into account the number of school days, holidays, and special events throughout the year. The fee is divided into three equal payment terms, due in February, June and October.

Term 1: February Term 2: June Term 3: October

Structural Fee and Term Fees are to be paid before the commencement of every Term. Term fee consists of Monthly Tuition Fee & Semester Fee.

- 4. Upon the commencement of the Academic Year 2025, the following must be paid
- Administrator Fee
- Books
- Insurance & Uniforms

5. Withdrawal of Enrolment

We requires one (1) month written notice or one (1) month Term Fee in lieu of notice of your intention to withdraw your child. Unused Term Fee will be refunded. The following will not be refunded. Administration Fee, Books, Insurance & Uniforms, and Term 1 (Structure Fee and Term Fee)

- 6. A late fee of **RM15** will be applied to any outstanding balance after the 7th of each month.
- 7. Payment can be via cheque (payable to **Dream Academy Sdn Bhd**), or bank transfer (**Public Bank A/C No: 3200061904**). For bank transfer payments, please notify us once the transaction has been made via email at **admin.tjc@dreamacademy.edu.my** or Whatsapp at HP: **010-317 7152.**

School Programmes Parents are encouraged to support their children by attending all or most of our school events.

Parent Teacher Meeting At the end of each semester, parents will meet with the respective class teacher on the progress of your child(ren). A notice will be sent out beforehand.

Excursions/Educational Visits

The school will organize excursions/outings which are an integral part of the overall school curriculum. Classroom activities are developed both before and after excursions. Therefore, it is beneficial for all children to participate with their classmates in the outings. This is seen as important both socially and educationally.

Notices will be sent out prior to the excursion and it is vital that the consent form is signed and returned to the school. Without a signed consent form, the child will not be allowed to join the excursion.

- Bible Devotion
 Bible devotions are part of our school curriculum.
- School Timetable (latest by 2nd week after commencement of school year)
 A copy of your child's timetable will be given to you.

Uniforms

Uniform must be worn daily to school. Shoes & socks must be worn at all times. Sandals are strictly discouraged. PE attires are to be worn on the stipulated PE day (Age 3: Playground day).

Name Tags



- 1) Clip-on: to be worn during the 1st month of school.
- 2) Sew-on: to be sewn on school uniforms and PE attire as shown in the photos below. Sew-on name tags will be given out together with uniforms and PE attire.

Once you receive the school uniforms, PE attire & Sew-on name tag, please sew the Sew-on name tag at the location as shown in the photos. Then, the clip-on Name-tag will be kept by the class teacher for future use.

Health and Safety

- Medical Emergency
 - In the event of an illness or accident needing immediate attention, the school will carry out the following steps:
 - 1. Render first aid as deemed fit.
 - 2. Make all reasonable effort to contact the parents/guardian.
 - 3. If deemed necessary or in emergency situations, the child will be sent immediately to the nearest clinic or hospital, of which all expenses are to be borne by the parents/guardian.
 - * Parents are required to notify the school of any medical condition your child may have, that requires special attention. This includes food and other allergies.
- Infectious Diseases

NO child should come to school if he/she is unwell (which includes fever, cold and runny nose, Hand Foot & Mouth disease, influenza-like sickness eye-infection, chicken pox, measles, cough, diarrhea and any other contagious illness). A temperature check will be performed by teacher on duty each morning. Children with a temperature higher than 37.5°C will be sent home. Please also be sure to notify the school when your child is not attending due to illness so we can remain aware of any present viruses or other seasonal illness prevalent in the community or school.

Students may only return to school following a contagious illness upon submission of a valid medical certificate (MC) or clearance from a licensed healthcare provider. In the absence of an MC, it is requested that students adhere to quarantine period of several days, in accordance with the guidelines set forth in the TJC Handbook.

Safety

We will help develop safety habits in children, such as the following:

- Know his/her own name
- How to cross roads correctly.
- To never run from behind parked cars.
- No running in school.
- Not to talk to strangers.
- To never accept rides in cars from stranger.
- Not to leave school grounds during school hours.
- Not to throw sticks, stones or other objects that could harm others.
- Not to handle sharp objects by themselves.

Discipline Policy

Discipline is a process of reinforcing positive behaviour while teaching children how to behave acceptably. Our policy is to provide an environment of love and encouragement which will enable children to resolve their differences and grow in maturity and self-control. Positive Discipline is different from punishment. Punishment tells children what they should not do; positive discipline tells children what they should do. Punishment teaches fear; positive discipline teaches self-esteem.

We use positive discipline by planning:

- Anticipating and eliminating potential problems
- Having consistent and clear rules that are manageable by the children
- · Having a well-planned daily schedule
- · Providing structure and support for children to resolve conflicts
- Shared ownership of the classroom (our room, our toys)

We use positive discipline by intervening when necessary:

- · Re-directing to a new activity
- · Diverting child from area of conflict
- · Providing alternate activities
- · Offer a choice of two acceptable options
- · Provide acceptable way to release feelings

We use positive discipline by showing love and encouragement:

- · Reinforcing positive behaviours
- · Demonstrating respect and care for each child
- · Appreciating the child's point of view
- Positive discipline takes patience, repetition and the willingness to work through problems.

Suspension or Expulsion Policy

Unfortunately, there are sometimes reasons we have to suspend or expel a child from our program either on a short term or permanent basis. We want parents to know we will do everything possible to work with the family of the child(ren) in order to prevent this policy from being enforced. The following are reasons we may have to suspend or expel a child from this school:

- The child is at risk of causing serious injury to other children or himself/herself.
- Parent threatens physical or intimidating actions toward staff members.
- Parent exhibits verbal abuse to staff in front of enrolled children.


